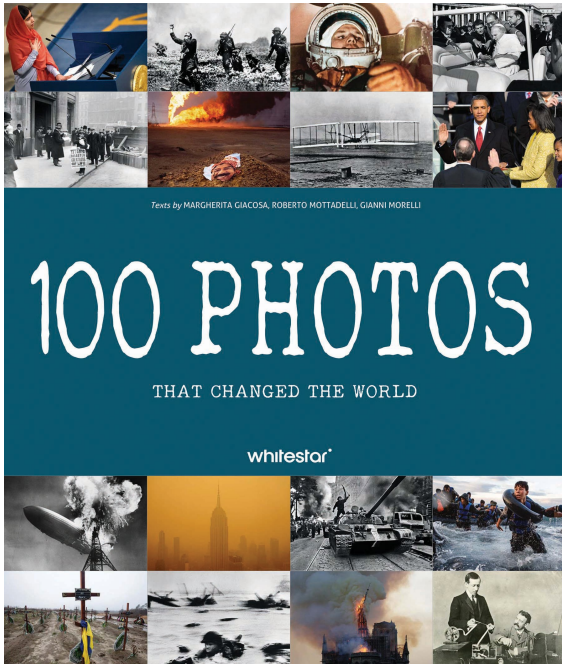




100 Photos that Changed the World
