Inspired by the music of Pacifist and the friendship of Sidharth, Apurv, Ashish, Utkarsh, and Varun, Vanhees constructs a visual story that feels both deeply personal and universally resonant.

**Against the Tide** becomes more than a photographic journey; it is a meditation on balance, belonging, and the search for stillness within the noise of modern existence.

**Wouter Vanhees** (b. Belgium) is a fine art photographer whose work focuses on the interplay between people, architecture, and the passage of time within urban environments. After relocating to Hanoi, Vietnam, Mumbai, India, and today Seoul, Korea, Vanhees began documenting the city's shifting identity amid rapid modernisation. His photography reveals quiet moments of contemplation in the midst of change, exploring how individuals and spaces adapt to evolving social realities. His images have been exhibited internationally and featured in contemporary art and photography platforms.
