


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Annapurni Heritage Cuisine from Tamil Nadu Sabita Radhakrishna

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The culinary heritage of Tamil Nadu is rich and full of surprises. From the special rasam of the Kongunadu people to the Anglo Indian pot roasts, Tamil cuisine goes beyond the hackneyed idli-dosai.
