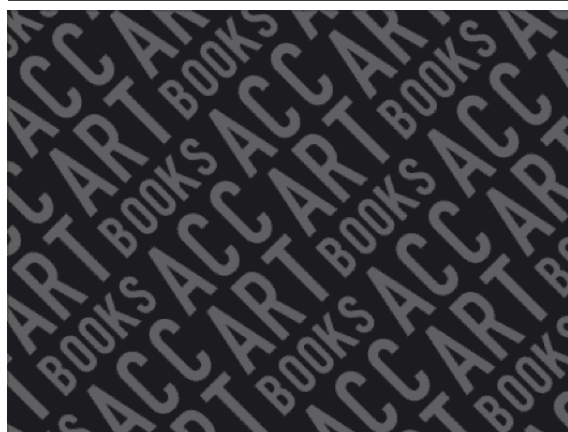




Around the World in Jewellery
