- Each page has a captioned sketches and text focusing on regional settlers, the barns they built, and the big changes influencing farming and barn building in the 100 years between 1860 and 1960

Illustrated with 200 barn sketches, diagrams, and maps, this book takes you on a journey through the St Croix River Valley. It grounds you in the geography, geology and biology of the region and introduces you to its original inhabitants, the Dakota and Ojibwe peoples, European explorers, fur traders and loggers and the settlers that followed them. It is a celebration of regional diversity and architectural expression through a single type of building — the barn.

Jim Lammers was trained as an architect when sketching was an essential part of the curriculum. He is a tireless writer and relentless sketcher. His work has been published in online and professional journals and his drawings have been exhibited at fine art venues. Jim lives on a hundred-year-old farmstead with a huge red barn in the St Croix River Valley.
