Dilys Rose is a Scottish poet and novelist who was born in Glasgow. Currently she is writer in residence at the University of Edinburgh where she teaches on a creative writing course. She has published *Our Lady of the Pickpockets*, *Red Tides* and a volume of poetry titled *Madame Doubtfire's Dilemma*. *Red Tides* was short-listed for both the McVities' Scottish Writer of the Year and the Scottish Saltire Book of the Year.
