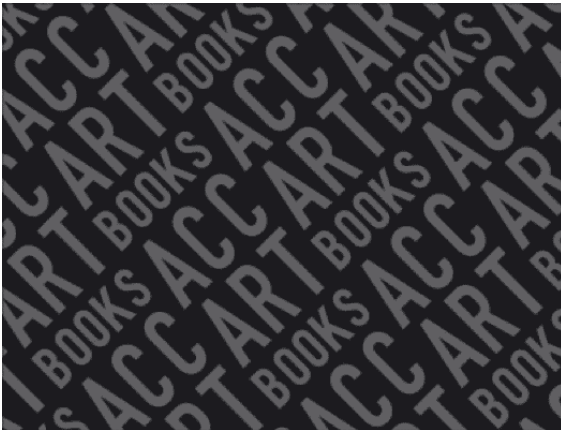




Peter Fischli and David Weiss—The Point of Least Resistance

Landmarks of Swiss Art

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- Peter Fischli and David Weiss are among the world's best-known contemporary Swiss artists whose joint work has been shown in solo exhibitions of major international museums such as MoCA (Los Angeles), Centre Pompidou (Paris), Museum Ludwig (Cologne), Tate Modern (London), Kunstmuseum Basel, and Kunsthau Zürich
- *The Point of Least Resistance* of 1980 is one of Fischli and Weiss's earliest collaborative works and already features core aspects of their later oeuvre
- The book explores the origins, context, and impact of this landmark of Swiss art
- Jacqueline Burckhardt and Bice Curiger are widely renowned experts on contemporary art and the work of Peter Fischli and David Weiss

Swiss artists Peter Fischli, born 1952 and David Weiss (1946–2012) gained worldwide recognition for the multifaceted body of work that they jointly created from 1979 until Weiss's premature death, spanning film, video, photography, sculpture, installation, and artist's books. *The Point of Least Resistance*, their first film of 1980, already features many of the elements that Fischli and Weiss would later revisit, explore in depth, and rework across all their media. Serious and humorous at the same time, it is an early self-portrait of the duo in which they, dressed as rat and bear, operate as detectives in the parody of solving a case in the art world. The animal-inspired satirical reflections and strategies border on the philosophical. Yet above all, the two protagonists are intent on explaining the world, a concept they elaborate on in much detail and through their fantastic diagrams.

Bice Curiger and Jacqueline Burckhardt, distinguished experts on contemporary art and the collaborative work of Peter Fischli and David Weiss, explore in this book the origins, context, and impact of *The Point of Least Resistance*, a landmark of Swiss art.
