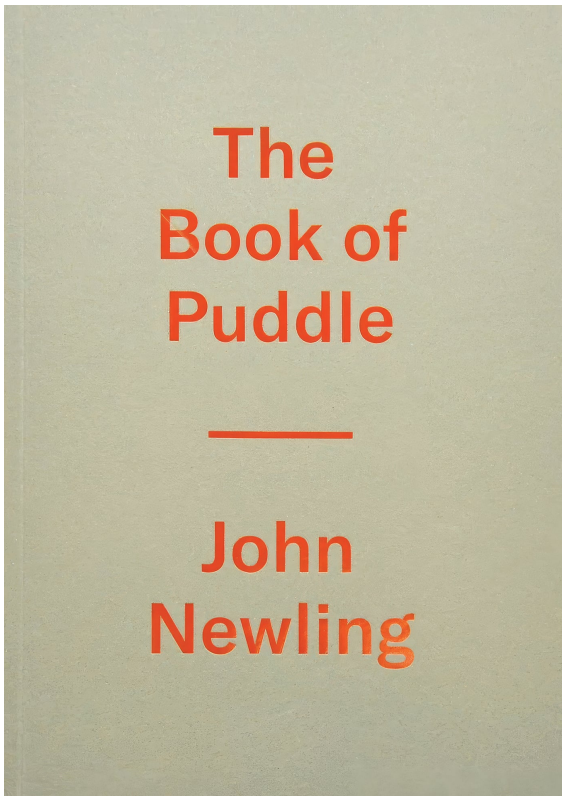

For more than four decades, he has pioneered an interdisciplinary practice spanning installation, sculpture, photography, drawing and text, becoming an influential figure in environmental and socially engaged art. Newling's projects have consistently brought together art, science, ecology and community, establishing him as a leading voice in conversations around nature, sustainability and contemporary culture. Alongside his artistic practice, Newling has made a significant contribution as a writer and educator, influencing generations of artists through his teaching and research. His publications combine striking visual material with thoughtful, accessible writing that resonates with readers interested in contemporary art, environmental issues, philosophy and nature writing.
