


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Thomas Hoepker

Thomas Hoepker

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- Thomas Hoepker was the first German full member of the renowned Magnum agency and later its president, so his name stands for iconic photography with an international reputation
- His photos have historical value, as they document significant moments of the 20th century, from the GDR to the USA to global events, and thus cast a light on society, culture and politics. Internationally exhibited, of high quality and prestige, his pictures are coveted collector's items
- Wide variety of subjects, ranging from urban snapshots in New York to travel photography and documentary reportage
- Not only historically significant, but Hoepker's works also have timeless relevance, as they stimulate current discussions about society and humanity

Thomas Hoepker (1936–2024) was a German photographer and documentary filmmaker. After studying art history and archaeology, he began working in 1960 for renowned magazines such as stem and Geo, serving as a correspondent in East Berlin and New York, among other locations. Hoepker was known for his elegant photography and compelling reportage. As the first German full member of the Magnum photo agency, he became its president in 2003. His works were exhibited and published internationally, including his books New York (2013) and Wanderlust (2014), both released by teNeues. Hoepker passed away in Santiago de Chile.
