


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Contemporary Jewellery in Context

He is guest teacher at the Akademie der Bildenden Künste Nuremberg (DE) and Alchimia, Florence (IT). Peter Deckers is an educator, organizer, curator, writer and jewelry maker/artist. He is jewelry coordinator and part-time art lecturer at Whitireia (NZ), Porirua. Sian van Dyk is the Curator, Programmes and Events at The Dowse Art Museum since 2013. In 2015 Van Dyk was the inaugural recipient of the Creative New Zealand Craft/Object Art Curator to Munich award.
