Her ambitious public realm artworks, such as *Green/Light* (*for M.R.*) (Folkestone Triennial), *Dutch/Light* (Turner Contemporary) and *The Hop* (Hayward Gallery), reflect her innovative approach to sculpture as a potent gathering place of people and ideas.
