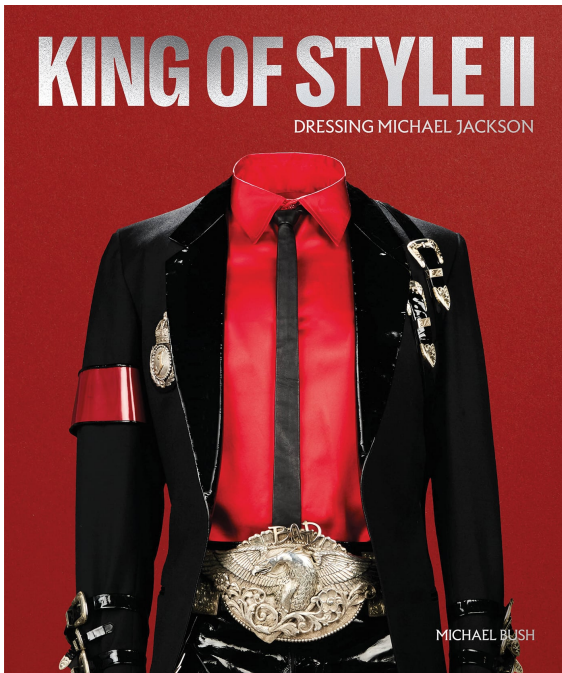

Here, he tells how he and Tompkins created Jackson's garments, from dazzling, dramatic stagewear to the singer's more amusing whims and fancies – such as jackets that flashed back at ever-present paparazzi to shoes that allowed him to lean at unnatural angles, to crystal-covered "iced" socks and gloves, military-inspired silhouettes – even a crown based on the Crown Jewels of the United Kingdom. **King of Style II** tells the inside story, in Bush's distinctly conversational manner, of how this creative journey and friendship blossomed, during the pinnacle of Jackson's global fame. Along the way we gain an unprecedented insight into one of pop culture's most recognizable creative partnerships.

Michael Bush is an American fashion designer, costume creator and author best known for his long association with Michael Jackson. Together with his creative partner Dennis Tompkins, "Bush" (as Jackson called him) worked with the singer for 25 years, designing and overseeing many of the singer's most recognizable stage costumes and signature looks, from military-inspired jackets and crystal-encrusted gloves to the costumes worn during major world tours and television appearances.
